YOUR INPUT MATTERS!

You are invited to a public workshop regarding land use planning around Aberdeen Proving Ground.

The Chesapeake Science and Security Corridor (CSSC), in cooperation with the counties of Harford, Cecil, and Kent, cities of Aberdeen and Havre de Grace, and agencies and organizations in the region, is preparing a Joint Land Use Study (JLUS) to address compatibility planning around Aberdeen Proving Ground (APG). The JLUS will explore impacts of community development on APG and vice versa, and will make recommendations to promote land use compatibility and collaboration. The goal of the JLUS is to reduce current and potential compatibility issues between APG and surrounding areas while accommodating new growth and economic development, protecting public health and safety, and sustaining the operational missions of APG.

The JLUS will assess 24 compatibility factors, identify existing or potential issues, and develop strategies to address the issues. The compatibility factors include, but are not limited to:

- Coordination / Communication
- Land Use
- Noise
- Safety Zones
- Light and Glare
- Vertical Obstructions
- Roadway Capacity
- Air Quality

In order to develop a plan that is responsive to local needs, input from the community is **essential**.
